Fertility building leys and green manures

This field lab will be run by Iain Tolhurst and Mark Measures at Tolhurst Organic, Whitchurch-on-Thames nr Reading, on 28th April 2015. We have good evidence and practical experience of the major benefits of diverse, multi-species mixtures for fertility building, forage production, pollinators and general resilience to unpredictable weather conditions. This field lab will share those experiences and set up trials to improve selection of species and assess performance of mixtures and Countryside Stewardship management prescriptions. <u>More...</u>
