Government organic support schemes




Who pays for what and why?

- Agri-environment schemes funded under the Rural Development Plans (part Member State and Part EU)
- Recognition of environmental benefits of organic farming
- Income forgone
 - Conversion and 'maintenance' payments
 - Different payments for different land categories/ use

What are your commitments?


- Land 'in conversion' of 'fully organic' continuously
- 5 year scheme
- Management control
- A plan
 - Organic viability proposal or copy of the conversion plan agreed with the organic control body(England)
 - Organic management plan (Wales)

Improved permanent grassland	Ploughed and/or received artificial fertiliser in last 20yrs
Unimproved permanent	Unimproved permanent grassland & rough grazing
grassland	below the moorland line in parcels < 15ha
Rotational land	Arable or temporary grassland
Horticulture	Land in a horticultural rotation
Top fruit	Top fruit & permanent bush crops
Enclosed rough grazing	Parcels < 15ha within a SDA & above the moorland line

Definitions



	Definition		
Rate 1	Permanent crops, protected crops & land in a horticultural rotation.		
Rate 2	All land not in Rates 1 or 3		
Rate 3	Unenclosed upland, Sole Grazed Commons & field parcels with > 50% grazed woodland, blanket bog, coastal lowland heath, Saltmarsh or bracken/scrub		

Combining management options

- Mid and Higher Tier
- Specific organic rates for some options
 - Overwintered stubble (£116/ha)
 - Wild bird seed mixture (£640/ha
 - Supplementary feeding for farmland birds (£494/ha)
 - Multi species ley (£115/ha)
 - Under sown cereal (£86/ha)
- Otherwise, organic options can be combined with non organic options unless specifically stated


Combining management options



- Glastir Entry and Advanced
- No double funding
- Few options not available to horticultural growers

Maximums and minimums

Minimum of value of £5000 over the 5 years



Minimum 3Ha, Maximum 400ha




How to apply

Must be registered with RPA/RPW Online

- Annual application windows
 - 1 July 30 September in England (tbc)
 - September/ October in Wales

Conversion start dates

 No more than 12 months prior to claim date (15 May)




• By the start of the agreement (1st January)

Other grants



- Countryside Productivity Scheme
 - Water management
 - LED lights for livestock housing
 - Slurry/ litter
 - Forestry grant
 - Controlled atmosphere storage grants
 - Remote crop sensing and robotics
 - Animal productivity, health and welfare grants
 - Currently closed for applications

Other grants

- Sustainable Production Grants Animal health and welfare, crop storage, and nutrient, energy & water efficiency. 40% funded minimum grant - £16,000 (Currently closed)
- Food Business Investment Scheme
 –Similar to the old
 Processing and Marketing Grants. 40% minimum grant £2,400. (Currently closed)
- Rural Community Development Fund Improvement/ expansion of local basic services. Community agriculture/ renewable energy project (Closes 31 Jan 2016)
- Next windows application spring 2018
